Motor Yacht Galileo G 55m Ice Class from the Vitruvius® series is the second of three motor yachts sold today by the [Perini Navi Group](#) and constructed in collaboration with Vitruvius Ltd and [Philippe Briand](#). Built for efficiency and for navigating in total autonomy, Galileo G has been designed and constructed following the guidelines for Ice Class (ABS Ice Class IB)

classification. The yacht can navigate the Northwest Passage from the Atlantic to the Pacific through the Canadian Arctic Archipelago.

The third yacht in this Picchiotti brand from the Vitruvius® series – [the 73m Vitruvius Superyacht hull C.2189](#) is currently under construction at the Picchiotti shipyard in [La Spezia, Italy](#). It is scheduled to be delivered in 2013.
